The **Bechdel test** asks whether a work of fiction features at least two women who talk to each other about something other than a man. The requirement that the two women must be named is sometimes added.

Only about half of all films meet these requirements, according to user-edited databases and the media industry press. The test is used as an indicator for the active presence of women in films and other fiction, and to call attention to gender inequality in fiction due to sexism.

Also known as the **Bechdel–Wallace test**, [2] the test is named after the American cartoonist Alison Bechdel...
